**Course outline:**

The course will cover elementary aspects of Analysis for functions of one or several real variables. It is the first part of the two-semester course which intends to prepare students for ordinary and partial differential equations, probability and many other fields of mathematics. The ideas and methods introduced here are fundamental, and are used in all areas of mathematics.

The following topics will be covered:

- Metric spaces
- Convergence and continuity
- Differentiation
- Riemann integration
- Successive approximations and applications
- Partial derivatives
- Multiple integrals
